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iii. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

*ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENT	<p>IELTS Standard Academic – minimum score 6.0 with minimum 5.5 across subcomponents (reading, writing, speaking, listening). For <i>Study Overseas</i> , IELTS Standard Academic – minimum overall score 4.0. IELTS UKVI Academic would only be required if a student were not to meet the required English Language requirement for undergraduate study and were to apply for a joint CAS number to allow them to enrol onto an intensive Pre-Sessional English programme after which they would enrol directly onto a degree level programme. This would mean that after finishing the intensive English language programme the student would not need to return home to apply for a Student Visa TOEFL iBT – minimum overall score 80 with the minimum sub-score: Reading 10, Listening 10, Speaking 17, Writing 19</p>
Study Overseas Programme	<p>UCLan’s Study Overseas programme allows international students to experience life and study in a UK university. We offer this to our incoming exchange students who have not managed to achieve the required English Language entry levels. OTHER ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS	<p>Minimum one-year study at home institution at Undergraduate level education for all degree level programmes * For International Business Communication – minimum two years’ study. *Available modules may depend on previous study</p>
REQUIRED DOCUMENTS	<p>Incoming Application Form Valid Passport Official University Academic Transcript Proof of English Language Proficiency (if native language isn’t English)</p>
EUROPEAN STUDENTS	<p>Following the UK’s Departure from the EU, European Students are now considered as International Students and are required to apply for a student visa. European Students will also be required to demonstrate evidence of their English Language in accordance with the UKVI regulations which should be B2 level or above and should be evidenced by IELTS or TOEFL iBT as per the English Language Proficiency Requirement above* We are no longer allowed to accept letters from your English Language Departments or ERASMUS OLS Results UCLAN’s English Language Academy offers an on-line E-TELL Test and to book a test you can contact the Academy at languageacademy@uclan.ac.uk</p>
CREDITS	<p>Students must take a maximum of 60 credits per semester (30 ECTS) and 120 credits (60 ECTS) per academic year.</p>
MODULES / COURSES	<p>Modules must be pre-approved BEFORE an application is submitted by your academic course leader and International Office. Module approval from UCLAN will be assessed on previous academic study.</p> <p>The Study Abroad Team will send students a list of modules for students to choose from. Once students have enrolled, they must check their timetables. Once teaching starts students will no longer be able to make changes to their timetables. The Study Abroad Team will provide a final date by which students will be able to make changes for both Full Year/Sem 1 and Sem 2 – changes will only be possible if there is a clash between modules.</p> <p>Semester 1 students must check if they have exams in January as they will need to stay in the UK to take these or arrange to take them remotely if possible.</p>

iv. FEES AND OTHER EXPENSES

TUITION FEES	Students participating in this exchange are required to pay tuition fees to their home institution but not to UCLAN.
ACCOMMODATION	<p>On campus accommodation prices start from (as of September 2023 subject to change in future years):</p> <p>Full Year 20/09/23 – 14/07/2024 - £3537.26 Sem 1 – 20/09/23 – 19/01/2024 - £1436.27 Sem 2 – 17/01/24 – 14/07/2024 - £2124.73</p> <p>Each hall is self-catering, and prices include all fuel and water bills.</p> <p>https://www.uclan.ac.uk/accommodation/</p> <p>Private accommodation is available off campus with the average cost of a shared house £67.50 per student per week and contract lengths normally vary from 38 to 52 weeks. These details are only a guide, and you should check the cost and contract length with your landlord. For more information contact privateaccommodation@uclan.ac.uk</p> <p>If you upgrade your accommodation you will be responsible for these costs direct to our accommodation office.</p> <p>Accommodation contracts have fixed lengths and cannot be changed. They can differ from the academic calendar such as semester 1/ semester 2/ full year term dates.</p> <p>Please note that students applying for private off campus for semester accommodation may be liable to pay Council Tax – these are the rules for Students and Council Tax - Student discount - Preston City Council We advise students applying for a semester to stay in on-campus or UCLAN owned accommodation.</p>
ACCOMMODATION TYPES	<p>There are around 2200 accommodation places in University owned and leased halls of residence. On campus accommodation is allocated on a first-come, first-served basis.</p> <p>En-suite options are available to full year students only.</p> <p>Although we do not recommend this, it is possible for students to live off campus. Students wishing to live off campus in private accommodation are responsible for making their own arrangements with the Landlord.</p>
HEALTH INSURANCE	<p>Incoming exchange students must provide their own personal and travel insurance. International Exchange students may need private medical insurance for emergency care – this is their responsibility to check with insurers.</p> <p>All students can register with our Student Health Centre. It is free to see a doctor, but students must pay for medication. Prescription charges apply to all at the current price of £9.15 per item (as of Sept 2020).</p>
LIVING COSTS	<p>The approximate cost of living per month (including rent) is £1023. This is only an estimate according to the UK Home Office.</p> <p>As all accommodation is self-catering you will find very reasonably priced shops and food outlets on or close to the campus such as Aldi/Lidl and Tesco.</p>

WELCOME WEEK	<p>During your first few weeks we will be running a Welcome Week programme to help all students settle into life at the University of Central Lancashire and in the UK. UCLan Welcome is a festival of activities and information sessions designed to help you get used to life at UCLan as well as life in the UK; along with a calendar of social events where you can meet other new students.</p> <p>Students will be issued with the International Arrival Guide before August, as well as a link to the Freshers' Week Programme of Events.</p> <p>Welcome Week is <u>mandatory</u> for all international students.</p> <p>The Study Abroad Team also hold a free getting to know you, welcome event in early October and early February, in which exchange students meet the team and other exchange students. We also arrange one UK based trip per semester for exchange students *small contribution required from exchange students to participate. **subject to COVID-19 Regulations</p>
DOCUMENTS REQUIRED ON ARRIVAL	<p>All students should provide their passport for proof of ID. Passports and visas will be checked during enrolment.</p> <p>Students are also advised to bring copies of their offer letter/CAS Letter and original academic transcript.</p>
